Gerard Conlon Are there any corrosion problems or just sediment?

Mayor Harter There are a couple leaks, they are going to take the panels off and replace while they are there. Put a lift in there, pump out the sediment, clean the inside, sanitize run tests, fill up, run tests again and it will be back online. That tank was put in in the 60's or 70's

Trustee Olejniczak Maybe 70's

MH its one of our issues with the hemolytic acids. There is 12 inches of sediment on the bottom

GK One of the meetings you discussed changing wooden fencing?

MH I am going to refer that to Attorney Cassidy

Attorney Cassidy We had previously adopted a fence code. Off the top of my head, I don't necessarily know we limited it to wood. It can't be a snow fence, chicken wire etc. It has to be a natural color. Subject to setback and size restrictions.

MH so vinyl is ok?

EC a well-maintained vinyl fence I think would be fine.
